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Foreword

This financial report presents the unaudited financial information, along with an analysis and commentary, for the third financial quarter ended 30 September 2018 for Core Government, and amounts here in are stated in Cayman Islands Dollars. The results of Core Government along with, Statutory Authorities and Government Owned Companies (SAGC's or Public Entities) are shown in the Statement of Financial Performance.

The information contained herein is based on records obtained from the General Ledger of the Government's financial management system. It is also based on the representations and judgments provided by the Chief Financial Officers of Ministries, Portfolios, Offices, and Statutory Authorities and Government Owned Companies.

Effective 1 January 2018 the Government transitioned to a 12-month financial year (1 January – 31 December).

As required by Section 29 (1) of the Public Management and Finance Law (2018 Revision) (the "PMFL"), the unaudited quarterly financial report will be published by notice in the Gazette, within six weeks after the end of each of the first three quarters in each financial year.

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Executive Summary

The financial results of the Core Government for the nine-month period ended 30 September 2018 (the period) show a \$172.8 million surplus (\$183.8 million for the Entire Public Sector (EPS)) and bank account balances of \$535.2 million in cash and deposits.

When combined with the performance of SAGC's, the overall surplus was \$91.2 million higher than the \$92.6 million EPS surplus the budget anticipated for the period. This was primarily due to higher coercive revenues (a positive variance of \$46.4 million – as per page 10) complemented by lower levels of expenditures in Personnel Costs (a variance of \$13.2 million – as per page 10) and Supplies and Consumables (a variance of \$15.1 million – as per page 10) within Core Government.

The Government experienced favourable variances to budget in most revenue lines, albeit not to the extent accomplished in coercive revenues. Sales of goods and services and investment revenue exceeded the budget by \$2.6 million and \$5.2 million, respectively (as per page 10). Additionally, favourable variances in Personnel Costs and Supplies and Consumables, were accompanied by lower expenditures in Transfer Payments (a variance of \$3.0 million – as per page 10) and higher than anticipated net Gains on Financial and Non-financial Instruments (a variance of \$1.4 million – as per page 10).

Adherence to fiscal policy continues to yield significant improvements in the overall cash and deposits balance held by Core Government. Operating Cash and Deposits were \$365.5 million and Reserves and Restricted Deposits were \$169.7 million, for a total Cash and Deposits balance of \$535.2 million.

Savings in areas such as Personnel Costs and Supplies and Consumables, experienced in the first half of 2018, remain intact through the Third Quarter; however, it is unlikely that the current level of savings will be maintained throughout the final quarter of 2018. Additionally, Personnel Costs are expected to increase due to the awarding of a 5% Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA), which was paid in September 2018 with an effective date of 1 July 2018.

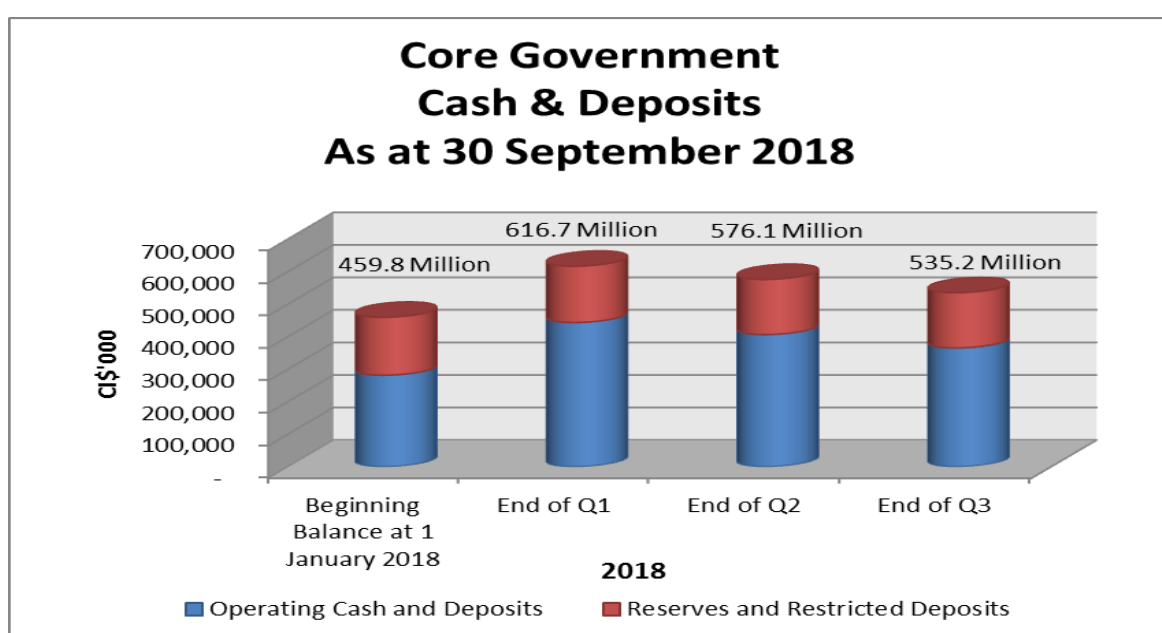

Comments with respect to balances reflected in the **Statement of Financial Position** for the period ended 30 September 2018 are as follows:

Cash

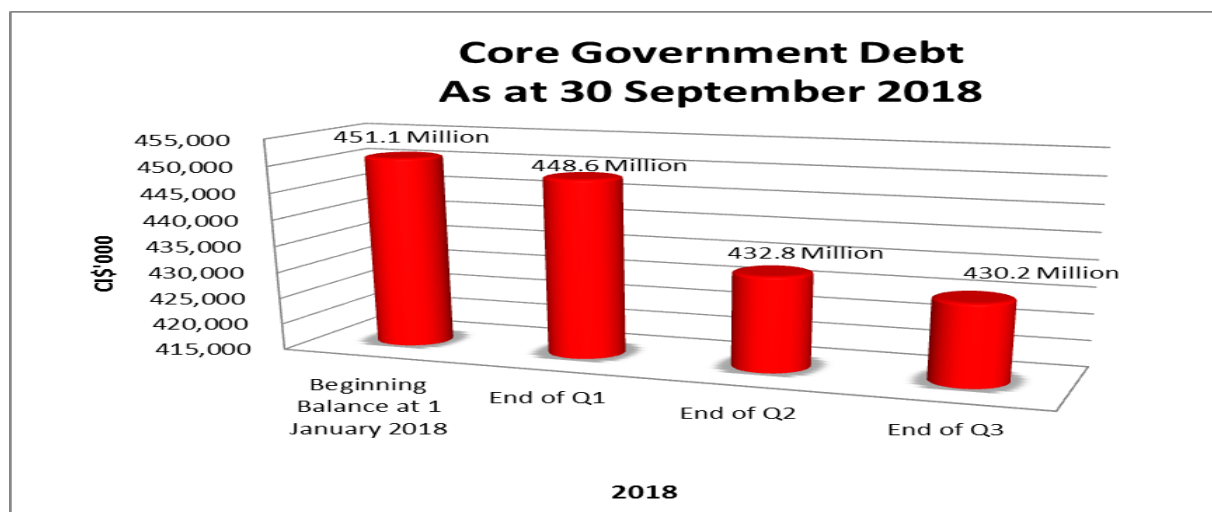
Cash and Cash Equivalents (including fixed deposits with maturity durations not exceeding 90 days) were \$46.1 million and Marketable Securities (comprised of fixed deposits with maturity durations exceeding 90 days but not exceeding one (1) year) were \$489.1 million, for a total of \$535.2 million with respect to bank account balances. Due to the significant cash balances on-hand, the Government now places funds on longer-term fixed deposits. These longer-term deposits are reflected as Marketable Securities (on the Statement of Financial Position) and are not included in the definition of 'Cash and Cash Equivalents', which only represent deposits that are less than 90 days to maturity. A substantial portion of Governments Operating Cash is likely to be used for repaying the bond obligation referenced below.



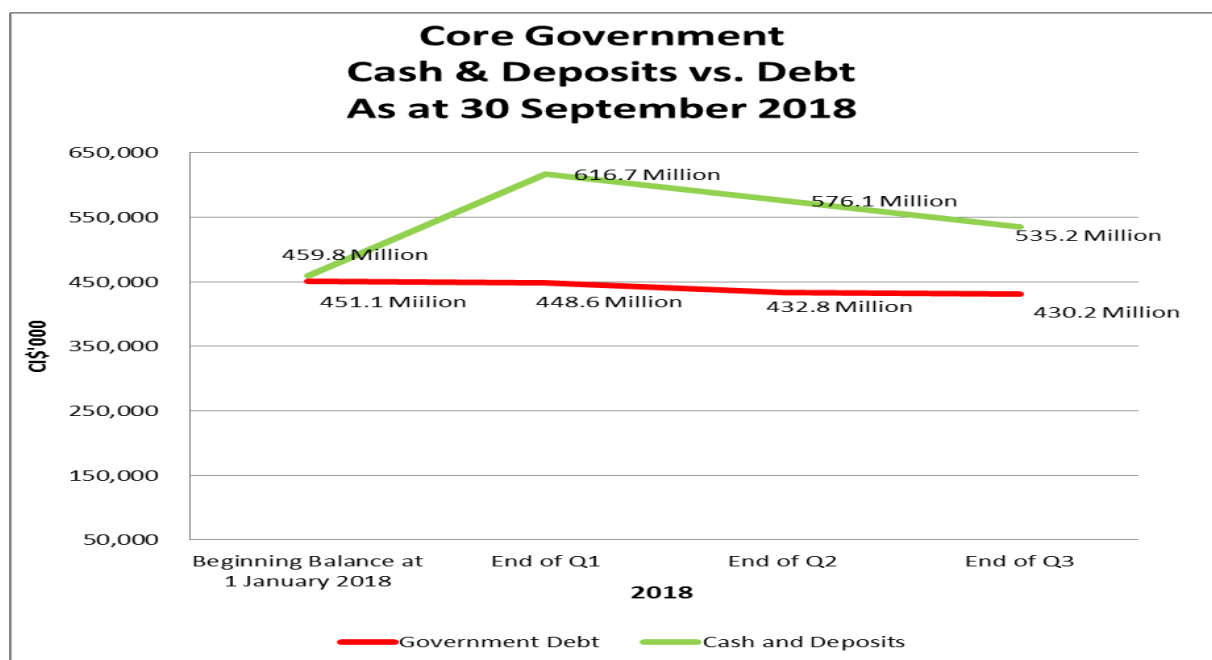
Borrowings

Core Government's most significant recorded liability was the Debt Balance which stood at \$430.2 million as at 30 September 2018 (\$25.7 million of which is due within one year), this was \$35.7 million lower than the debt balance at 30 September 2017. Additionally, the Unfunded Pension Liability was \$420.3 million (with respect to the Defined Benefit portion of Public Sector pension plans). The Debt Balance continues to decline with scheduled principal repayments being made. The Government will repay its outstanding US \$312 million bond obligation in November 2019.

Revenues

Coercive Revenue

(See pages 24 to 26)

Coercive Revenue recorded for the first nine months of 2018 was \$46.4 million above budgeted expectations. This positive variance, (the amount of each variance is shown in brackets in the details that follow), was mainly concentrated in Levies on Property (Stamp Duty – Land Transfers, \$16.4 million); Import Duties (Other Import Duty, \$7.8 million, Alcoholic Beverages Duty, \$1.8 million, Gasoline and Diesel Duty, \$2.3 million, and Motor Vehicle Duty, \$1.6 million); Other Levies on International Trade and Transactions (Cruise Ship Departure Charges, \$0.9 million); and Domestic Levies on Goods and Services (Bank and Trust Licences, \$4.3 million, Mutual Fund Administrators, \$3.9 million, Tourist Accommodation Charges, \$5.0 million, Tax and Trust Undertakings, \$1.5 million, Other Company Fees – Exempt \$1.5 million, and Traders Licences \$1.3 million and Building Permit Fees \$1.3 million). These positive variances from the budget are offset by negative variances in Annual Permanent Resident Work Permit Fees, Work Permit Fees and Provision for Continuation of Work Permits - Grant.

Stamp Duty on Land Transfers was higher due to higher volumes of property transactions coupled with increasing property values; this trend will likely continue through the end of 2018. Banks and Trust Licences Fees were higher than anticipated due to fewer terminations than expected and fees being charged on higher asset values held by the licensees. Mutual Fund Administrators fees were higher due to the increase in the number of funds processed when compared to expectations. Tourist Accommodation Charges were favourable mainly due to record high visitor arrivals (approximately an 18% increase, in combined air and cruise arrivals over last year) as a result of persistent strategic marketing, coupled with the residual effects of the eastern Caribbean (BVI and Puerto Rico) being hit by devastating hurricanes last year.

Despite overall favourable results in revenues, when compared to the Budget, there were areas that fell short of projected results; in particular, Annual Permanent Resident Work Permit Fees (\$2.0 million negative variance), Work Permit Fees (\$3.5 million negative variance) and Provision for Continuation of Work Permit – Grant (\$4.5 million negative variance). It should be noted that in the case of Annual Permanent Resident Work Permit Fees and Work Permit Fees, both revenue streams are performing higher than actual results from the previous year but, are below the anticipated level for the current year. Provision for Continuation of Work Permit – Grant was lower than the prior year as well as current year's budget projections.

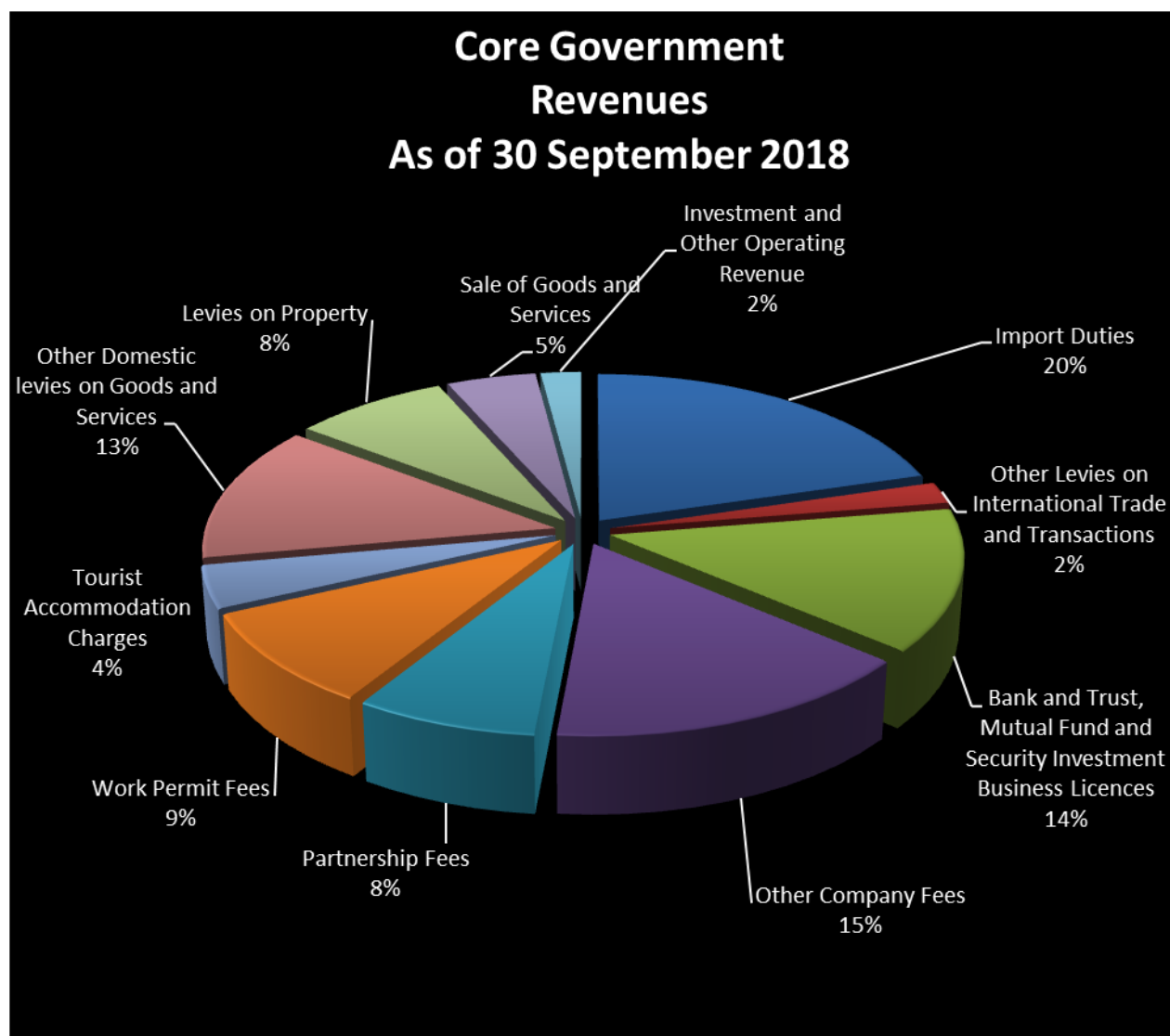
Annual Permanent Resident Work Permit Fees were lower than estimated due to the change in classes of Permits being applied for at a lesser fee. Work Permits Fees are also lower than anticipated due to refunds arising from Work Permit cancellations. Provision for Continuation of Work Permits – Grant fees were lower as there are a decreased number of Permanent Residency applications, and requests are either granted or denied.

The Third Quarter generated revenues of \$140.8 million and was 8% (\$12.1 million) lower than the Second Quarter (\$152.9). The majority of this change (between the second and third quarters) related

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to Coercive Revenue, which decreased by 8% (\$11.8 million); the majority of this quarter-on-quarter decline was due to a \$7.8 million decrease in Levies on Property, combined with decreases in Domestic Levies on Goods and Services of \$1.7 million and lower Import Duties of \$1.6 million.

Sales of Goods and Services and Investment Revenues held consistent, producing a combined \$12.7 million income (for the Third Quarter), which was only fractionally lower than that generated in the previous quarter.



Expenses

Personnel Costs

(See page 18)

Costs relating to personnel for the first nine months of 2018 amounted to \$212.7 million, resulting in a savings in Personnel Costs of \$13.2 million compared to a budget of \$225.9 million. This favourable variance is the result of several Ministries and Portfolios having numerous vacant posts which, to date, remain unfilled - including positions for the Fire Service and the Workforce Opportunities & Residency Cayman (WORC) Department. Although there was a recent hiring of Prison Officers, the savings realised due to the delay in filling these positions will persist to year-end.

For the Third Quarter, costs relating to personnel increased by \$2.2 million when compared to the Second Quarter's costs. Personnel Costs held consistent at approximately \$70.0 million for each of the previous two quarters. The recent awarding of a COLA (paid in September 2018, retroactive to 1 July 2018) was the major factor in the quarterly increase.

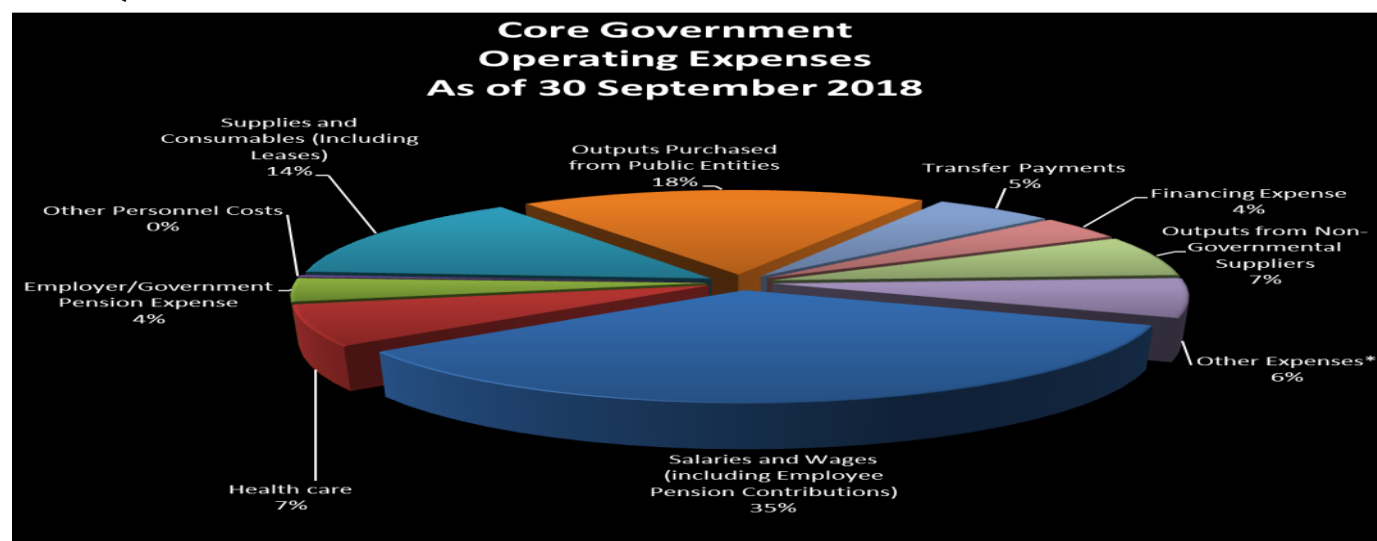
Supplies and Consumables

Favourably lower than projected expenses for supplies and consumables of \$62.3 million were recorded for the first nine months of the 2018 year, producing a savings of \$15.1 million compared to budgeted costs of \$77.4 million.

The most significant savings continue to be related to the Purchase of Services which accounts for 67% of the overall variance. Ministries and Portfolios continue to indicate that spending is anticipated to increase as the year progresses and costs will realign closer to budgeted projections by the end of the 2018 year. However, there will most likely be some degree of underspend existing at year-end.

Supplies and consumables of \$21.0 million incurred in the Third Quarter were consistent with that of the Second Quarter.



Performance of Statutory Authorities and Government Owned Companies

(See page 23)

Public Entities recorded a combined net Operating Surplus of \$11.0 million; this was \$15.2 million more favourable than budgeted for the period. Based on the most recent information received from SAGCs, this favourable variance is largely attributed to results being better than expected at: the Cayman Islands Airports Authority; Cayman Islands Monetary Authority; the Health Services Authority; the Water Authority; the Port Authority of the Cayman Islands; the Cayman Turtle Centre; the National Roads Authority; and the Maritime Authority. These favourable variances were partially offset by the unfavourable performance of Cayman Airways Limited.

SAGCs contribution to the Net Surplus amounted to \$0.7 million in the Third Quarter; this was lower than the contribution levels seen in the previous two quarters. There have been indications that the favourable performance of SAGCs is likely to continue to taper off during the remaining three months of the year.

Net cash inflows from Operating Activities totalled \$153.4 million for the nine-month period.

Investing Activities

(See page 15)

Investing Activities relating to fixed deposit maturities yielded \$372.6 million.

Additionally, \$529.9 million was used for Investing Activities, of which \$462.7 million relates to placements of fixed deposits. The effect of the movement (i.e. \$372.6 million less \$462.7 million) is an increase in the net amount placed on fixed deposits of \$90.1 million. Additionally, \$67.2 million was utilised for Capital Investment and Expenditures relating to purchases of Property, Plant & Equipment (\$39.1 million) and Equity Investments in Public Entities (\$28.1 million).

Financing Activities

Debt principal repayments were \$20.6 million for the period.

Conclusion

The overall fiscal performance reported for the period shows an EPS Net Surplus of \$183.8 million, which is 99% (\$91.3 million) higher than budgeted. This favourable position was due to revenues and expenses favourably outperforming initial projections by 9% (\$54.4 million) and 4% (\$21.6 million), respectively. Additionally, Statutory Authorities and Government Owned Companies contributed a further \$11.0 million to the overall surplus for the Entire Public Sector. The SAGCs performance exceeded the estimated results to 30 September 2018, by \$15.2 million.

Government's Cash position ended at \$535.2 million at 30 September 2018: \$112.0 million higher than anticipated in the 2018 Plan & Estimates, as Government continues to build on the favourable performance experienced in previous years. A significant portion of this cash will be used for the bond repayment in November 2019.

As customary, due to the cyclical nature of revenues, the Third Quarter's Coercive revenue results of \$128.2 million was expectedly lower than revenues earned in the previous quarters (Q1: \$332.8 million, Q2: \$140.0 million). This steady decline in quarterly revenue is a direct result of Financial Services fees being due in the beginning of the year, and higher earnings on Stamp Duty – Land Transfer transactions in the Second Quarter. Additionally, the Third Quarter incurred the same amount of expenses as the Second Quarter, \$158.8 million, respectively.

The performance of the first three quarters of the year has positioned the Government to be optimistic about reaching its budgeted performance. If Ministries, Portfolios and SAGCs remain diligent the Government should, at a minimum, achieve the budgeted EPS Net Surplus of \$81.0 million at the end of the 2018 year. However, the performance of the final quarter of 2018 will determine whether the Government meets its budgeted performance, or surpasses it by a significant margin. It is anticipated

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that expenditure will, at a minimum, stay at the levels seen in the second and third quarters. Positive results in revenue are expected to sufficiently mitigate any additional costs; however, proper diligence must be maintained.
